Reports to:	<i>Pastor of Children's Ministry (primary)</i>

Purpose

The FGMB Church Internship Program provides opportunities to receive personal and spiritual mentoring as well as leadership development, ministry experience and a glimpse into the life of a person in ministry through participation and leadership in summer ministries of the congregation.

Duties and Responsibilities

Primary Responsibilities:

Children's Outreach Program Director

- Provide leadership in planning, promotion, leader recruitment, preparation, setup and cleanup for program under the direction of the Children's Pastor
- *Focus of this program is with our Pembina Place Apartment neighbours*

Bible Day Camp (VBS) Program Director

- Provide leadership in promotion, leader recruitment, preparation, setup and cleanup for program under the direction of the Children's Pastor
- Program leadership role during the week of Aug. 19-23

Secondary Responsibilities:

Summer Kids Church

- Assist the Children's Pastor in planning, coordination and leading of children's activities during summer worship services
- Assist with administrative tasks and preparation of materials

Canoe Trip Prep

- Preparation of supplies, meals, equipment for 3 planned canoe trips under the direction of the Youth Pastor
- *Planning and/or leading a canoe trip may be an option if qualified*

Summer Youth Ministry Events

- Assist the Youth Pastor with preparation and leading activities and connecting events for youth during the summer as time permits

Additional Responsibilities:

- Assist the FGMB staff and pastoral team with other duties and ministry activities as time permits

Qualifications

Qualifications and Requirements include:

- A follower of Jesus Christ, able to affirm the MB Confession of Faith
- Preference given to active members of a Mennonite Brethren congregation
- Must be a post-secondary student planning to return to studies in the fall or currently completing their final year of studies
- Preference given to those enrolled in ministry-related studies
- Teachable spirit and demonstrated desire to learn
- Able to work independently and take initiative
- Strong interpersonal communication skills – written and verbal
- Strong organizational skills and ability to lead a team of volunteers
- Familiarity with Microsoft Office
- Willing to undergo police background check
